Our board is key to delivery of the organisation's many initiatives, and we are looking for two dynamic Non-Executive Directors - one independent and one elected - who will be able to bring relevant, commercial experience to our board, as well as a passion for supporting and challenging the Executive Team.

It is an exciting as well as challenging time to be joining us. We are working hard to manage the sport's Return to Play following the shutdown, throughout which process the diligence and care we have shown to our members has earned us many plaudits both from within and outside the sport.

This includes removing the barriers that inhibit better representation at coaching, officiating and administration levels in the game.

- Continuously improve the way we govern and develop basketball so we can secure sustainable growth and success, attracting brands/partners to invest and serve the current and future needs of our members
- Continue to build on the strengths of basketball in terms of its dynamic game, diversity, appeal to young people and social impact, including the growth of 3x3 and further diversification of the sport.

While previous board or business experience may be useful, it is not essential. Candidates seeking their first board role who show the commitment and potential to drive change will be considered and supported.

Basketball England is fully committed to equality in terms of opportunity and open access. Basketball England is actively encouraging applicants from diverse backgrounds.


We are using a blind recruitment technique for the independent role so your demographic details will not be available to the short listing panel. You are required to complete our equal opportunities monitoring form.



INDEPENDENT OR ELECTED?

Independent Directors are free from any close connection to the organisation. A person may still be deemed independent if they play the sport but generally we are looking for people who can provide objective scrutiny through their own current and previous experience from outside the organisation.

Elected Directors are appointed to the board as part of the election process as outlined in our articles of association [HERE](#). Elected Directors are from within our sport and must be appointed through an election process in which our voting members can vote for their preferred candidate. The candidate with the most votes will be appointed an Elected Director for an initial term of three years.

PRIMARY DUTIES

1. To establish policies, procedures and strategies regarding the governing of Basketball England's operations.
2. To set the strategic direction and priorities for the organisation.
3. To identify and manage risks.
4. To employ, manage and work with the Chief Executive in a strategic manner.
5. To monitor and evaluate organisational achievements.
6. Each Director should apply the level of skill and judgement that may reasonably be expected of a person with his or her knowledge and experience.
7. Directors with special skills and knowledge are expected to apply those skills and knowledge to matters that come before the Board.
8. Directors are not to be deployed to undertake executive roles or be over involved in day to day business. They are required to comply with a Director code of conduct, the UK Governance Code for sport and company law.

A list of nominations shall be distributed by the Company Secretary to all Full Members alongside the release of the Annual General Meeting notice, and agenda.
