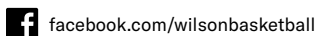
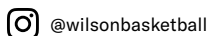

MANCHESTER MYSTICS VS GCA HARINGEY ANGELS

The weekend starts with an intriguing North v South contest as Manchester Mystics take on GCA Haringey Angels.

The Mystics can enjoy a break from their battle with Lancashire Spinners at the top of the U16 North conference, with both teams currently sat at 8-0, for a shot at cup glory this weekend.

Their opponents are also unbeaten this season though, with the Angels sitting pretty at the top of the South 1 division thanks to their spotless 9-0 record.

Straight-forward wins against City of Birmingham, Mystics II and Sheffield Hatters led the North West side to a road semi-final against Richmond, which they narrowly claimed 65-60.

Haringey have enjoyed a similar path to the final, with victories against London Thunder, St Albans and Harris Federation Knights Croydon, before triumphing 57-51 away to Bristol in another gripping semi-final.

Both teams are enjoying stellar campaigns in 2021/22, but only one team can take home the first silverware of the weekend.

Beaten finalists in 2018/19, Richmond Knights will once again try to capture the Sure Shot U16 Boys National Cup as they take on Islington Panthers.

Richmond are currently fourth in the West Premier, but their 6-1 record has them in with a shout of top spot should they be able to win their games in hand.

Islington are a more curious team to gauge. With the bulk of their current U16 National Cup roster playing their league minutes in the U18 competition, their U16 team is currently 0-10 and bottom of the South 4 conference. It's worth noting that Islington's U18s are 6-1 and top of the South 3 standings, however.

The Knights have been largely untroubled en route to the final, with just one of their five games being less than a double-digit victory.

Richmond's cross-Capital rivals have also enjoyed a relatively simple path to the final, with four comfortable wins and a bye before a nail-biting semi-final. The Panthers made their road trip to Manchester worth it though, stealing a 73-70 win and a spot in today's final in the process.

COLA SOUTHWARK PRIDE VS IPSWICH

Familiar foes CoLA Southwark Pride and Ipswich will lock horns once again on Saturday afternoon as the two teams vie for the Sure Shot U18 Women's National Cup.

Southern Conference rivals in the Women's Elite Academy League (WEABL), the two teams also contested last season's WNBL Division Playoff Final, with Ipswich sealing the D1W crown last May.

The Suffolk side are the current holders in this competition after a 60-57 victory against Reading in 2019/20, whilst CoLA last won this competition back in 2016/17.

Both these teams currently sit in the four-team South Premier, but with only one game played up to this point, a better comparison could well be WNBL Division One.

With largely similar rosters, Pride are currently 12-0 unbeaten leader's of the WNBL's top tier, having also beaten Ipswich 60-48 in their only meeting so far this season.

Still, in cup basketball, anything is possible, and this is an Ipswich programme that knows how to get the job done.

MANCHESTER MAGIC VS SUSSEX STORM

North Premier leaders Manchester Magic take on Sussex Storm for the Sure Shot U18 Men's National Cup, providing a fitting end to Saturday's action.

Magic will be hoping to utilise some partisan local support and after losing the 2017/18 final to Charnwood, their fans will no doubt be eager to see the North West outfit go one step further here.

Sussex have been struggling with indifferent league form this season, their 3-3 record is only good for 10th in the Eastern Premier, including losing two of their last three games.

Storm's cup form has been excellent by comparison, with wins against Islington, Surrey Rams, London Greenhouse and Team Solent Kestrels, with the pick of the bunch being a stunning 86-78 semi-final win against Western Prem's Charnwood College Riders.

Manchester have also had to work in recent rounds, with a 66-62 quarter-final victory against local rivals Myerscough being followed up by a tricky 94-86 semi-final win on the road against Bracknell Cobras.

Saturday's action will close with our fourth champions of day one, but will the U18 trophy be staying up North or heading down South?

STOCKPORT LAPWINGS VS TEAM SOLENT KESTRELS

Stockport Lapwings are aiming to become just the second team to win the WNBL National Cup from outside of the WNBL's top flight.

Looking to recreate Ipswich's fairytale from 2017/18 when they defeated Essex Blades, Stockport have similarly played well above their current standings to reach the final.

The North West upstarts have already claimed the scalps of 2019/20 finalists Nottingham Trent University, D1W title challengers Thames Valley Cavaliers plus runaway leaders CoLA Southwark Pride.

Two of those victories have come on the road as well, as did Stockport's opening round W against local rivals Manchester Mystics.

Captain Jade Butters continues to be a catalyst for her side's success, scoring 18 points in the come-from-behind shock against Thames Valley, also top scoring with 15 points in the upset against CoLA.

In Rachel James, Megan Collins, Rosie Hynes and Butters, Stockport have a back court quartet that can cause problems for any team in the WNBL, regardless of division. That theory will be put to the test in Manchester as Stockport look for one final victory to cap their dream run to National Cup success.

Standing in their way and looking to play spoiler are Team Solent Kestrels. The South coast side spoiled the party for another D2 side's hopes earlier in the competition as they beat Sheffield Hatters II, also knocking out D1 rivals Worcester Wolves in round one and Anglia Ruskin University in the semi-finals.

Krisztina Velkey-Cleeve led her side with 14 points in the win over ARU, and her form since she return to action after an extended break suggests the Hungarian guard hasn't suffered from the time off.

In Faye Endean, Solent possess one of the brightest young lights in the WNBL, with the guard a regular selection in the division's Team of the Week. Anna Nevison is also a player on the rise and has contributed to plenty of Solent's performances this year.

Adding in the talents of American forward Molly Danielson and Hungarian Detti Balla and coach CJ Lee has plenty of weapons at his disposal in the quest to bring the WNBL National Cup back to Solent.

Stockport will no doubt be looking for some home support in the North West if they're to pull off a shock. Solent will need to be on their guard to ensure they don't get their name added to the Lapwings' list of top flight upsets, though they have a deep and talented roster that is continuing to challenge for a top four spot in WNBL Division One.

STOCKPORT LAPWINGS' MEGAN COLLINS:

"We've worked really hard this season and I think it's definitely showed in our results. We trust each other to step onto the court every game and do what's needed.

"We're excited for the final and are prepared to fight until the end to lift the trophy on Sunday!"

SOLENT KESTRELS WOMEN'S COACH, CJ LEE:

"It'll be a different experience for us in the sense that we have not played Stockport before, so I am going back to my northern days of playing against teams from or around Stockport in the past.

"Teams from that area are certainly very physical, do a lot of the things that don't show up on a stat sheet and do the basics really well and that wins you ball games. However for us, we come into this final with a lot of confidence, we're playing smart and exciting team basketball at the moment. But at the same time, we know that this will be a challenge for us."

SOLENT FORWARD, MOLLY DANIELSON:

"It's a really cool opportunity for us to play in a championship game and for me, I am really looking forward to travelling up to Manchester and competing.

"For us as a team, we're in a good place right now. It's about staying together, making sure our attitudes are positive and playing our basketball. If we do those things, I think we'll be good."

TEAM NEWCASTLE UNIVERSITY VS TEAM SOLENT KESTRELS

The National Cup finals weekend comes to a close with Sunday's showpiece between Team Newcastle University and Team Solent Kestrels.

As a pair of NBL Division One rivals, both these sides are familiar with each other and have already met once this season back in October. That tie went the way of the Kestrels, 101-82, with guard Luke Busumbru scoring 23 points.

That result was one of Solent's 12 victories this season in D1, and their 12-2 record has put them in second place as they chase a historic fourth consecutive regular-season title.

Coach Guymon's side have tasted success on multiple fronts in recent seasons. As defending National Cup champions, Solent have been involved in three of the last four finals and are enjoying a dominant spell at the top of the NBL.

Their roster is as deep as it is talented, and with some recent injury woes seemingly now behind them, the Kestrels are back to firing on all cylinders.

American guard Cole Gentry is enjoying a strong debut NBL campaign, averaging 19.3PPG and 5.4APG in D1M this season. Fellow American Travis Charles is a former NBL playoff finals MVP, Orlan Jackman and Elliott Sentence both have BBL experience to their name and Andre Arissol is the reigning D1M Defensive Player of the Year.

With the ability to hurt teams at both end of the court and plenty of big game experience across their roster, Solent are a formidable opponent for any team.

Team Newcastle's own ascent appears to be a work in progress, but they have come a long way in recent seasons. More importantly, they're still improving and this weekend's National Cup final appearance is testament to that.

Only promoted to the top flight ahead of the 2020/21 season, The North East side surprised many to finish their debut campaign with a 13-6 record, good for fifth spot. Currently seventh, Coach Elderkin's team have also been to the first final of the 2021/22

season, losing out to Derby Trailblazers in the L Lynch Trophy two weeks ago.

Although that showpiece ended in defeat, reaching such a level shows the trajectory of this team and a place in the NBL National Cup final is another example.

In American guard Ronald Blain, Newcastle have a strong Player of the Season candidate with multiple Player of the Week honours already under his belt this year.

David Moya, Martyn Gayle and Brandon Federici have all excelled this season, and the Knight's have scored 96.3PPG so far this season as one of the most explosive offences in the NBL.

Having lost to Solent in each of their last three meetings, history hasn't been kind to the North East underdogs. But throughout the Kestrels' recent stretch of NBL dominance, the last few months may represent their leanest patch, with defeats in multiple competitions.

If there's a time for Newcastle to stage an upset, it could be now.

TEAM NEWCASTLE UNIVERSITY'S MARTYN GAYLE:

"We set high exceptions for ourselves right at the start of the season and nothing about our cup run has been lucky. We earned it and expected nothing less.

"We know how it feels to reach a final and fall short so our only focus is on lifting that National Cup."

TEAM SOLENT KESTRELS' CAPTAIN ELLIOT DADDS:

"I'm really looking forward to getting the chance to go out and compete for silverware again against a really strong Team Newcastle side.

"We all play the game to be a part of games like these and the whole team is eager to go and leave everything on the floor, and to bring the Cup back to Southampton."
